Triumphal Entry

After He had said these things, He was going on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. When He approached Bethphage and Bethany, near the mount that is called Olivet, He sent two of the disciples, saying, “Go into the village ahead of *you*; there, as you enter, you will find a colt tied on which no one yet has ever sat; untie it and bring it *here*. If anyone asks you, ‘Why are you untying it?’ you shall say, ‘The Lord has need of it.’” So those who were sent went away and found it just as He had told them. As they were untying the colt, its [b]owners said to them, “Why are you untying the colt?”



Luke 19: 28-38

Triumphal Entry

34 They said, “The Lord has need of it.” They brought it to Jesus, and they threw their coats on the colt and put Jesus *on it*. As He was going, they were spreading their coats on the road. As soon as He was approaching, near the descent of the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the miracles which they had seen, shouting:

“Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord; Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!”

FINAL Triumphal Entry

Rev. 19:11,

And I saw heaven opened and behold, **A WHITE HORSE**
and He who sat on it is called **FAITHFUL and TRUE...**

v. 13 - He is clothed with a robe dipped in blood
and His name is called **The Word of God.**

v. 16 - And on His robe and on His thigh He has a name written,
KING OF KINGS, AND LORD OF LORDS.
